Firekeeper's Daughter is a YA thriller and mystery about an eighteen-yearold Ojibwe girl named Daunis Fontaine.




For a debut novel, it is surprisingly good. I did not have high expectations when reading this, so it wasn't anything I expected. I thoroughly enjoyed this book. I am not a big fan of thrillers and mystery. I prefer fantasy, but was it impressive. I loved how I gained knowledge about Ojibwe culture, and I love how this book ties into reality. It made it easier to see life in Daunis' shoes and relate to all the characters present.

It was an extraordinary, intriguing, addicting book. I would spend most of the day reading this book, never wanting it to end. I would recommend this book to everyone, even if this isn't your favourite genre. This book is suitable for ages 12+.




