Tax Clinics

Over 600 low-income customers got help filing their taxes at our annual Volunteer Tax Clinics, in partnership with Revenue Canada's Volunteer Income Tax Program.



Community Support Pop-ups

Weekly pop-up Social Services Community Supports with Ontario Works Outreach Workers help visitors find employment help, information about income tax and Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP).

New pop-up Meta Employment Services help people with resume development, job search support and ODSP application.

Virtual Library Cards

Virtual cards were introduced for people who prefer to use our digital resources such as eBooks.



Visiting Library Service

We visited and delivered books to over 1,000 people that were unable to travel to the Library.
